



Human Trafficking Education

State of Michigan Education Requirement

As of Jan. 4, 2017, a new law amending the Michigan Public Health Code (MCL 333.16148) requires all licensed health care professionals in the State of Michigan to complete training to identify victims of human trafficking.

R 338.120 Training standards for identifying victims of human trafficking; requirements. Rule 20.

(1) Pursuant to section 16148 of the code, MCL 333.16148, a licensed physician or licensure applicant shall complete training in identifying victims of human trafficking that meets the following standards: (a) Training content shall cover all of the following:

- (i) Understanding the types and venues of human trafficking in the United States.
- (ii) Identifying victims of human trafficking in health care settings.
- (iii) Identifying the warning signs of human trafficking in health care settings for adults and minors.
- (iv) Using resources for reporting the suspected victims of human trafficking.

Please note: The State of Michigan requires a one-time Human Trafficking training, but CME is not required for this State of Michigan requirement at this time (9/19). CME is not available for this activity.
